Last week soldiers who were at the hotel that night spoke about a "lost weekend" in Nanyuki when the British Army released hundreds of personnel from a base for what turned into a three-day bender involving mass brawls, binge drinking and sex with local women.

Military police officers dispatched to break up fights between regiments were "hurled off balconies".

The night Agnes vanished, the Lions Court Hotel had descended into debauchery, according to soldiers and local women. Prostitutes were going into huts for orgies with soldiers in exchange for a few pounds, according to one soldier

He claimed that there were 60 soldiers in the hotel, partying with "about 40 sex workers". "When we got back they [the army] made us get mass-tested for HIV," he said.

The nine murder suspects were identified from the hotel's check-in records. None was questioned or

asked to provide a DNA sample, despite requests from the Kenyan police. The Ministry of Defence said it had seen no such requests but had helped with preliminary inquiries.
